This interactive class emphasizes both the Telecommunicator and Responding Officers important roles in properly and effectively handling incidents that can result in damage, injury or death. During lecture, workbook, guided discussion and group participation, the student, whether new or experienced, will identify, discuss and apply skills presented that will enable them to be “at the ready” for any type of calls for service. Domestic Violence calls are occurring more frequently and with differing severity, this program will give students a solid, useful foundation for handling these types of calls.

During the program students will listen to actual calls and work together to identify the best type of communication for the caller type. Students will breakout into small groups to work on practice crisis situations, applying new knowledge into practice immediately. Audio and video calls, along with news stories, will illustrate different types of domestic calls, and group discussion will be utilized to decide the appropriate method to handle these callers from the request for service through officer arrival.
